PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

Monday was World Kindness Day. To celebrate this day, we met as a school at a Good News Gathering and we were joined by a special guest, Pastor Erick Olsen from the Congregational Church in Norfolk. During Bullying Awareness Month, our students wrote about strategies to prevent bullying. Pastor Olsen's teen group, Mission Impact, selected three pieces of writing for their creativity and message and Pastor Olsen came to recognize these students. Congratulations to...
