ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

NEW ROOF FOR BOTELLE

RECORDS DISPOSAL

In keeping with state and federal regulations on records retention and disposal, school officials plan to destroy records of Special Education and 504 students who left or graduated from Regional School District No. 7, Barkhamsted Elementary School, Colebrook Consolidated School, Botelle School in Norfolk or Hartland School on or before June 30, 2017 or were born before July 1, 1999. Please be advised that records may be needed for Social Security benefits or other purposes. The destruction is scheduled to take place on or after July 1, 2024. PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

In April, we are shifting our Celebrating All, Creating Community theme to Earth Day. This month, students will learn about the importance of protecting our planet and ways they can make an impact. Morning announcements will feature information and tips. We are viewing the eclipse today and on Monday, April 22, we will celebrate Earth Day with billions of other people around the world.

We have partnered with local organizations to make our Earth Day celebration an interactive community event. Great Mountain Forest will take students on a guided hike behind the school. Northwestern students and staff, along with the Norfolk Farmers Market will teach students about gardening and help students plant seeds for a salsa garden. Ms. Eileen from the Norfolk Library will read aloud an Earth Day picture book and complete a craft with students. Our staff will lead other activities like recycled instrument making, kindness rock painting, a scavenger hunt and making a pinecone, peanut butter bird feeder.

At 11:30, the Norfolk landscaping company, Consolini and Tonan, will help our students plant a Unity Tree. Student Council, when planning Unity Day in October, wanted to plant a tree as a reminder of the importance of inclusion and acceptance. We are planting a black gum tree, a native species that has bright orange leaves during the fall. Consolini and Tonan are donating the tree and their services to bring this plan to fruition.
