SHARED SERVICES INTEGRATED PRESCHOOL PROGRAM (SSIPP)

The SSIPP is an integrated preschool program serving the needs of children ages 3 to 5 in the towns of Barkhamsted, Colebrook, Hartland and Norfolk. The program is located at the Barkhamsted School and follows the Barkhamsted School calendar.

A screening is being offered on March 21 and March 22, 2024, for parents who have concerns regarding their child's development. The screening process helps to identify children who may need intervention to perform successfully in school. Identified children will qualify to become a participant in the Shared Services Preschool Program.

Parents who are interested in having their child attend Shared Services Integrated Preschool Program as a role model must submit their child's name at this time as well. In the event that there are more role model applicants than slots, a lottery will be held.

To be eligible for the program, children must live in Barkhamsted, Colebrook, Hartland, or Norfolk; be age 3 by September 1; and must have attended the screening. The lottery will be held the week following the screening and parents will be notified of lottery results.

PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

Yesterday in art, Ms. Bazelmans led her primary students in giving peer feedback on their artwork. The students had created a 3-dimensional vase filled with hand drawn flowers that were outlined in black marker and glued onto the paper background that was painted with watercolors. The students were very proud of their work and the work of their classmates. Ms. Bazelmans gave them the option

of getting feedback from their peers and if the student agreed, they stood in the front of the class, Ms. Bazelmans holding up the art, while the class first said together, "Ooh, aah," as a collective appreciation for what they were seeing. Afterwards, the artist called on a classmate for feedback. The feedback was varied and specific - "I like the wavy lines on the flower you drew," "Your background is pretty because you used rainbow colors," and "I like how your flowers reach above the background," were just a few of the specific compliments students gave one another. The arts and PE are not "specials", they are "essentials". Students who have instruction in the arts and PE have opportunities beyond academics to identify and grow their interests. These essentials ask our students to create, problem solve, and challenge themselves in different ways. These experiences, along with social emotional and academic learning educate the whole child - something we are committed to at Botelle.

We are grateful for your support in this endeavor and for your ongoing communicating with us. Thank you for the emails, texts and phone calls that make us aware of your child's changing needs. When we know what your child is telling you at home or what you are noticing, we can partner together to best support your child. Please continue to keep the lines of communication open. Feedback is an important ingredient that helps children make progress, but it is also important for us as educators!
