## PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

Students and staff enjoyed Earth Day. Learning about nature, gardening and pollinators with guest teachers from the community, along with hands-on activities, really engaged our students. Students had a guided hike with Matt and Vicki from Great Mountain Forest. They planted seeds for a salsa garden with Mr. Wilde and his Vo-Ag students from Northwestern. Ms. Eileen and Bina, from the Norfolk Library, read them an Earth Day book and helped them create seed balls that, when planted at home, will attract pollinators. Our staff also planned learning stations like making instruments from recycled items, painting kindness rocks and making pinecone and peanut butter bird feeders.

The finale was planting our Unity Tree. Each student shoveled some dirt in the hole until our tree was firmly planted in the ground. In the fall, its leaves will turn bright orange and remind us of the importance of including and accepting all. The tree is planted near the lower driveway, on the grassy hill, across from the playground path. Thanks to Mrs. Bottom and Zach from the Norfolk landscaping company, Consolini and Tonan, for donating the tree, digging the hole and giving your time.
