PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

Our theme this year is "Celebrating All - Creating Community" and our focus for the month of September is encouraging creativity. Mrs. Bazelmans is working with our students to create a community quilt. Students, staff and community members are encouraged to design a paper triangle for the quilt and Mrs. Bazelmans will assemble it as a symbol of our interconnectedness.

On Friday the 15th, we are celebrating International Dot Day, based on the book, The Dot by Peter Reynolds. Students will get their creative juices flowing with different activities that encourage and celebrate the creative process - an important component of educating the whole child!

Sharing one's creativity requires vulnerability and risk taking. This is why a positive, safe and caring learning environment is so important. Our students - particularly those who have the same teacher again this year - have fallen right back into the familiar routines and community established last year. This is part of the magic of the multi age learning model.
