PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

This year we are using a new literacy resource and students are learning to read, write, speak and listen while also learning information. For example, all students are in an informational reading and writing unit, but each class is studying a different topic.

- Early Primary students are learning about the different types of animals in the Zoology unit.
- Primary students are becoming entomologists and learning all about bugs.
- Intermediate students are learning about weather and extreme weather phenomena like hurricanes, blizzards and droughts.
- Upper Intermediate students are becoming ecosystem experts. Different topics like oceans, savannahs, rainforests and deserts.

Students are researching a bug, weather phenomena or ecosystem of their interest and will create a beautiful, informational text based on that research. Ask your child what their topic is and what they are learning about it
